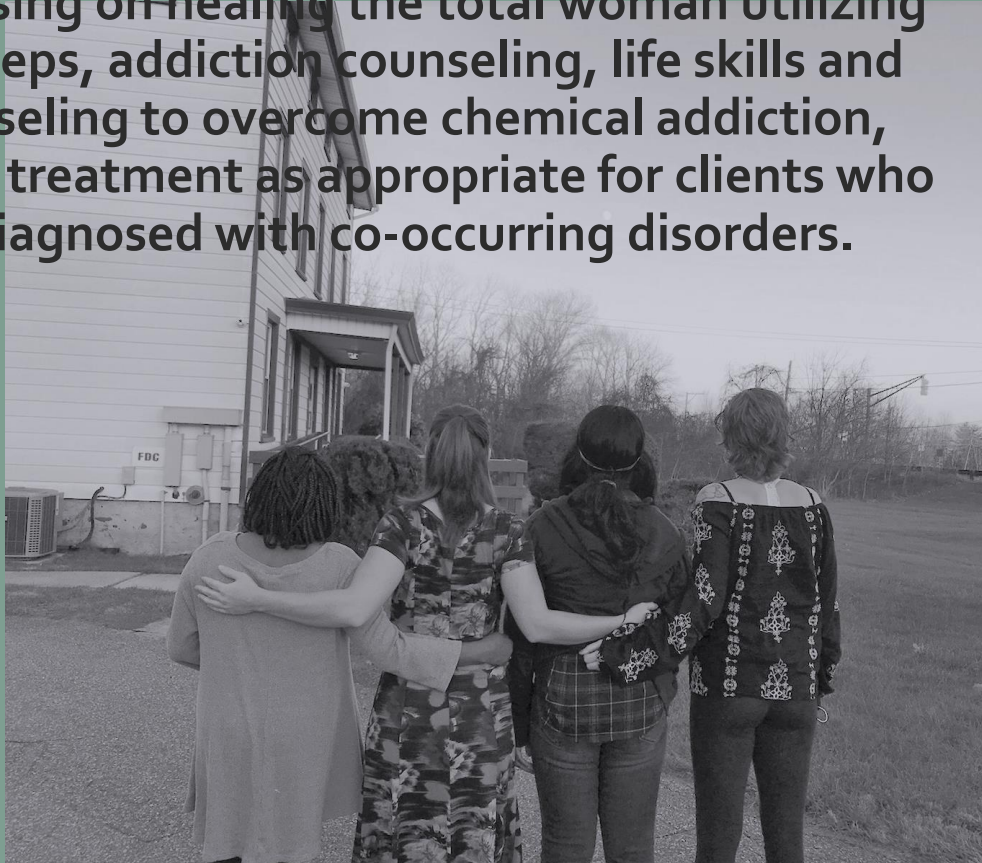

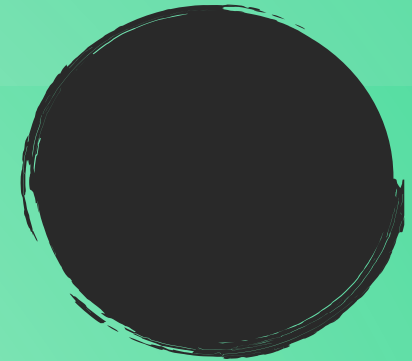

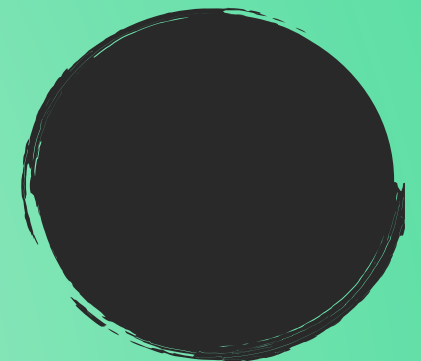

Expansion Update



Mommy & Me

Key expansion initiative for 2022

- Vision: to provide a safe and accepting environment for young moms (18+ years old) who are homeless and impacted by substance abuse. While offering ongoing support through practical life skills training, therapy, continued education and spiritual discipleship
- Property: Currently investigating launch at Healing House, Deaconry Basking Ridge
- Funding: Gift received from LCPC to kick off grant RFP process.
- Grant applications are in progress, but are limited at present
- Looking at other capital funding events to raise forecast annual budget of \$400k



Alumni Bridge Program

The Alumni Bridge vision consists 3 bridges:

- Bridge 1 – **Butterfly House** a step down program for graduates. Requires new property and staffing
- Bridge 2 – Communication & Mentorship. Groups and 1-1 support to prepare women for full integration back into society
- Bridge 3 – Case Management licensed support for clients' ongoing sobriety, as required
- Bridge 4 – Giveback opportunities to volunteer or intern at various GNH programs.

Detailed proposal was drafted in June 2021 . We hope for initial kick off by Q3 2023

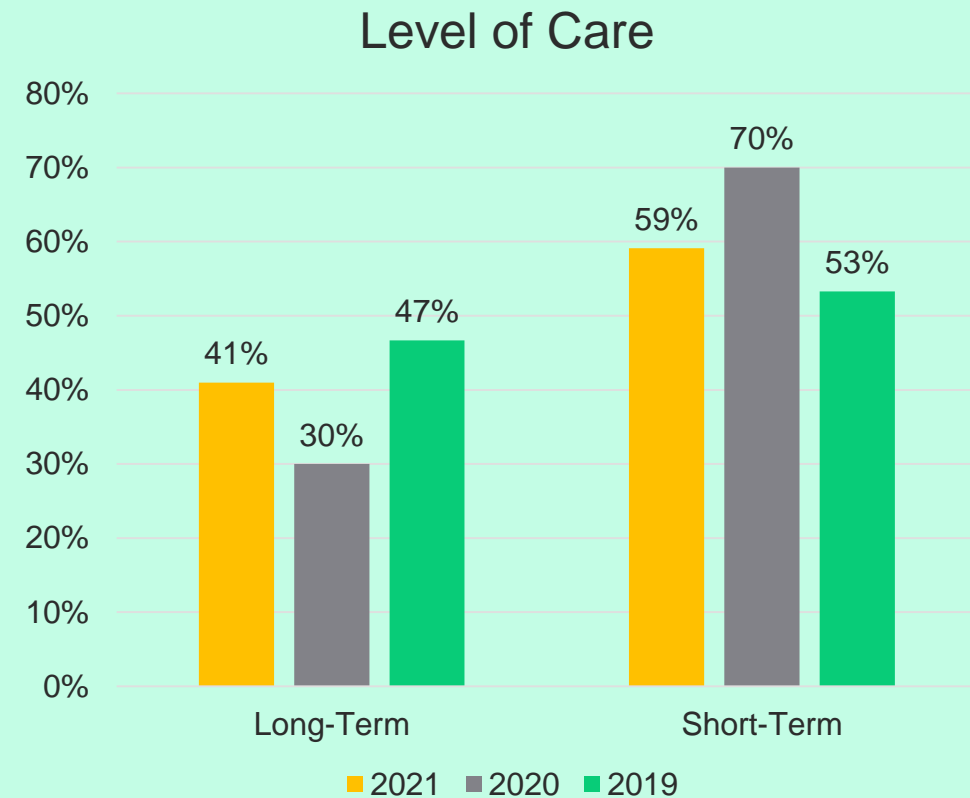
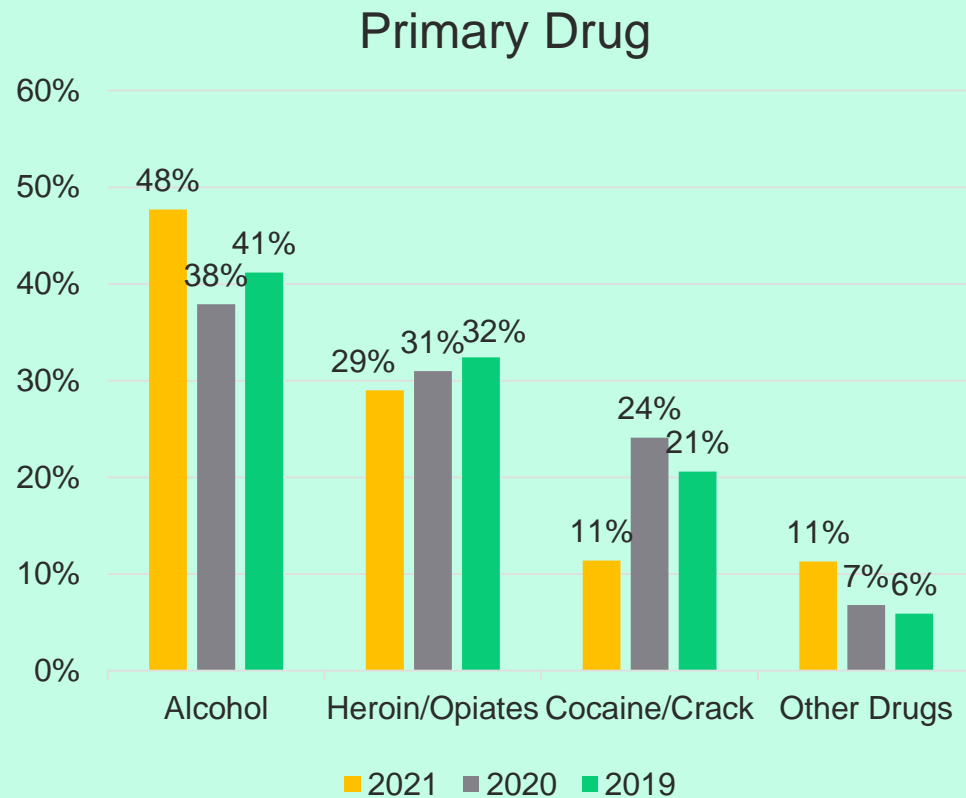

CLIENTS SERVED OVER PAST THREE YEARS

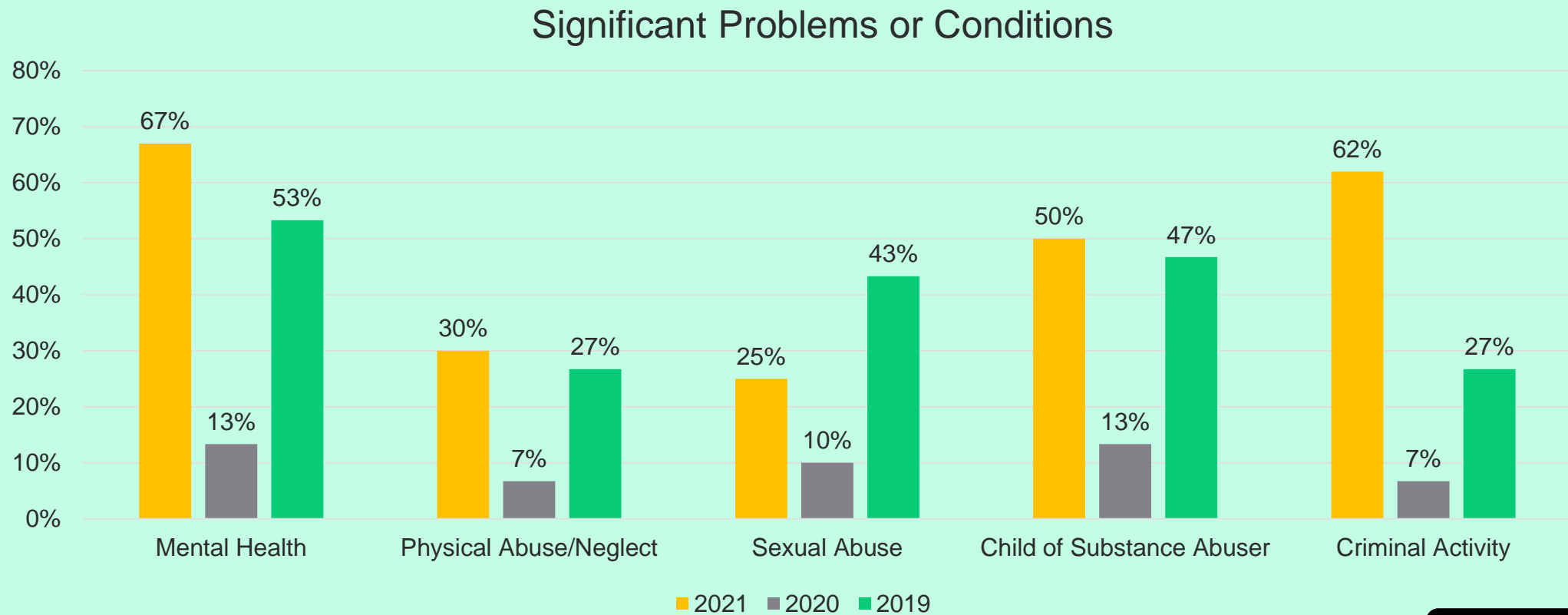

2nd Floor Renovation

Project scope: Fit out the second floor of the barn with 2 additional classrooms, 2 bathrooms, and storage room.

- The total construction cost is \$234,584, about \$250,000 when including all associated costs.
- All funds are in hand to complete the project from grants and private donations.
- The construction contract has been awarded to Eckelmann Brothers Construction.
- Construction will begin in about two weeks and will be completed by end January 2023

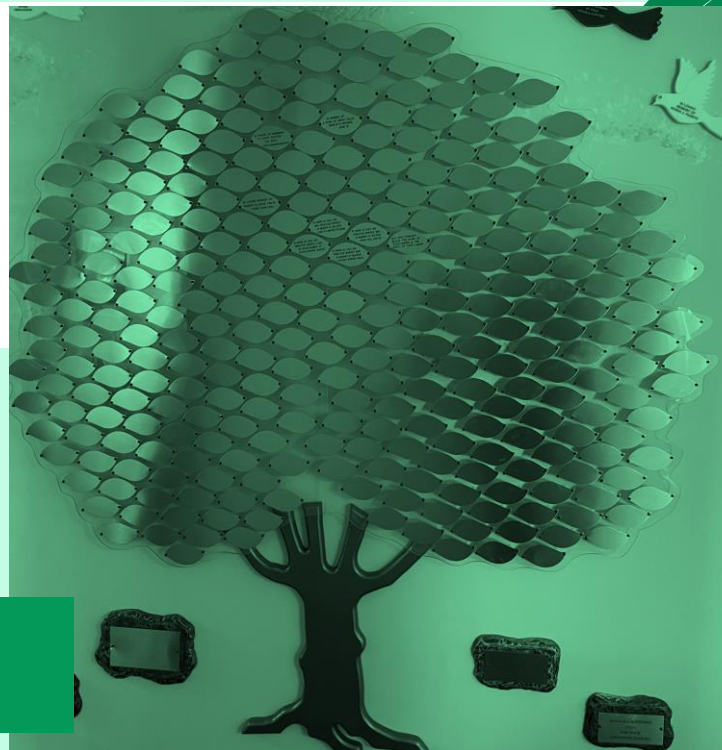

Accounting Matters



- Good News Home, Inc. is a New Jersey not-for-profit corporation founded by G. Tracey Ginsburg in 1983. Income is tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the *Internal Revenue Code* and under Title 15 of the *State of New Jersey Corporations and Associations Not-for-Profit Act*.
- We are licensed by the State of New Jersey, Department of Human Services, Division of Addiction Services, as a residential substance abuse treatment facility.
- Financial Statements are based on the *accrual basis* of accounting in accordance with GAAP, *FASB Accounting Standards for Not-For-Profit Entities*, and *FASB Accounting for Contributions Received and Made*. As required, we classify and report Net Assets Without Donor Restrictions and Net Assets with Donor Restrictions.
- A portion of our revenue is from cost-reimbursable federal contracts, which are conditioned upon certain performance requirements and/or the incurrence of allowable qualifying expenses.
- An Audit is performed each year in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*. Over the past several years, Nisivoccia LLP has performed this audit, prepared our Financial Statements, and prepared and filed our required Informational Returns: IRS Form 990 and NJ Form CRI-300R.
- Our residence and treatment facility occupy premises located in Raritan Township, NJ, at 33 Bartles Corner Road under the terms of a 13-year lease dated Nov 30, 1997. This lease expired on Oct 31, 2020, and was renewed for an additional 5 years expiring on Oct 25, 2025.

Federal Grant Support



In 2021, we received \$673,641 from two Federal Grants from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS); \$582,542 was for treatment services and \$99,999 was for Shelter Support (2020 COVID)

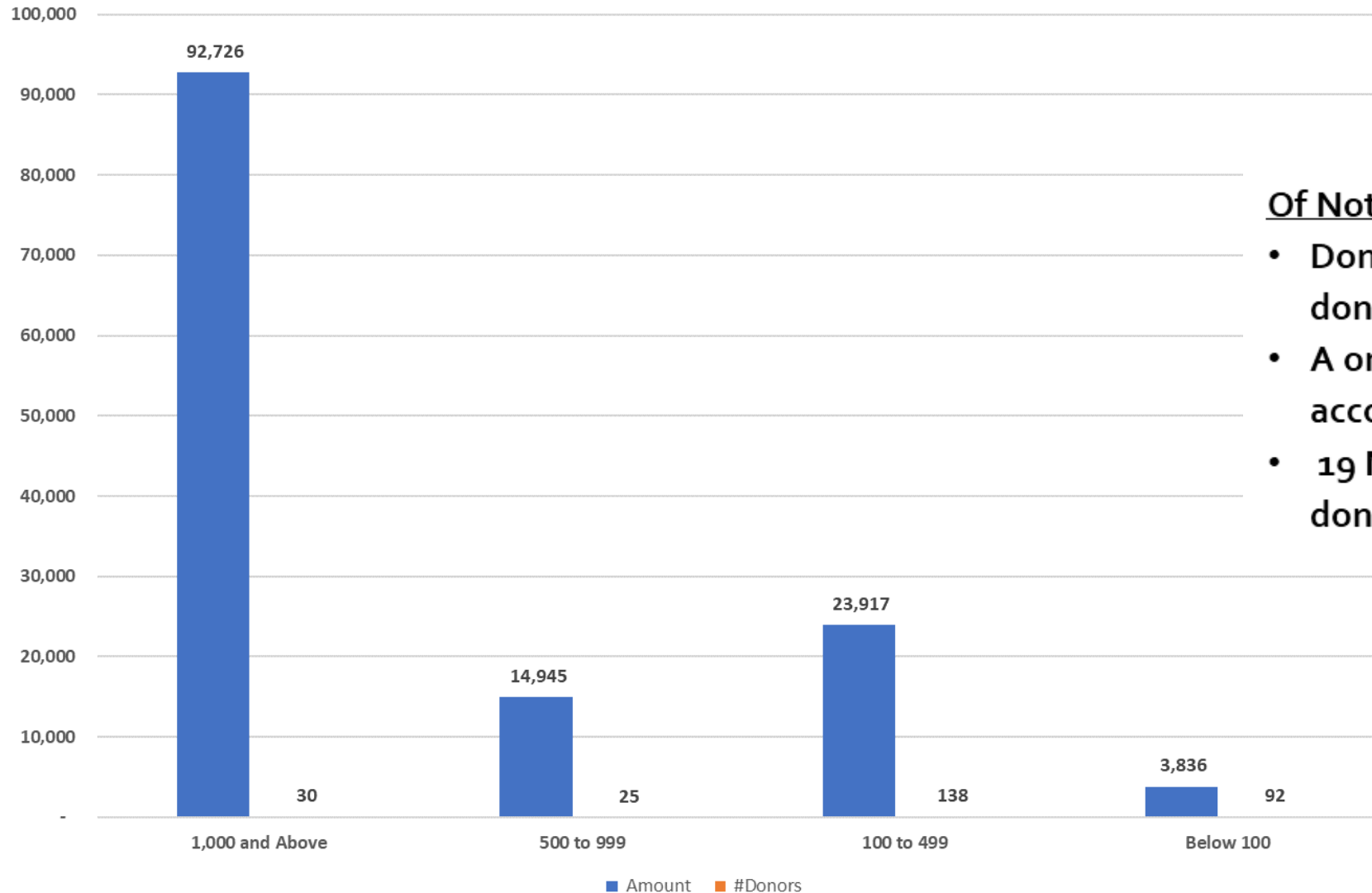

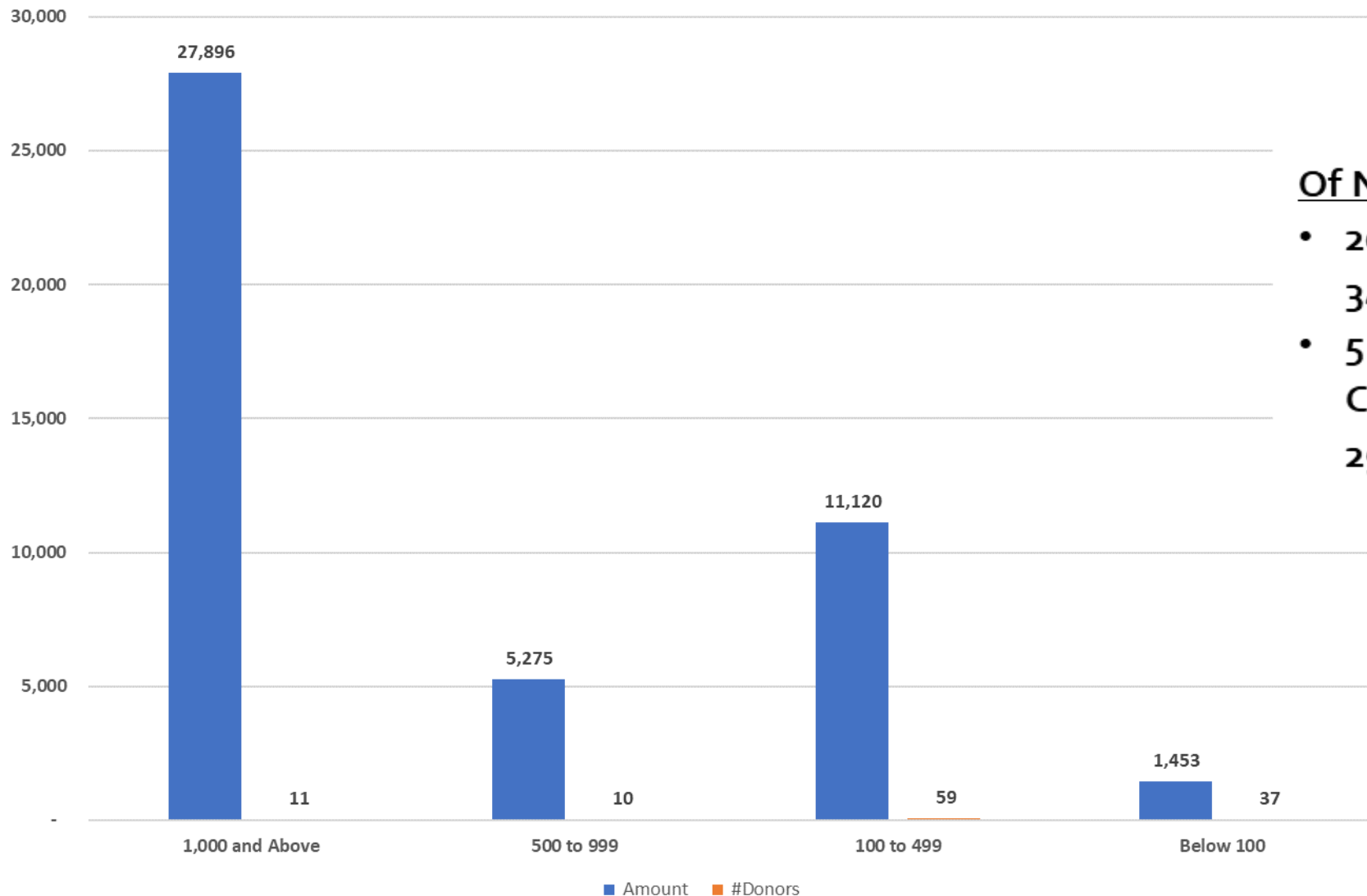

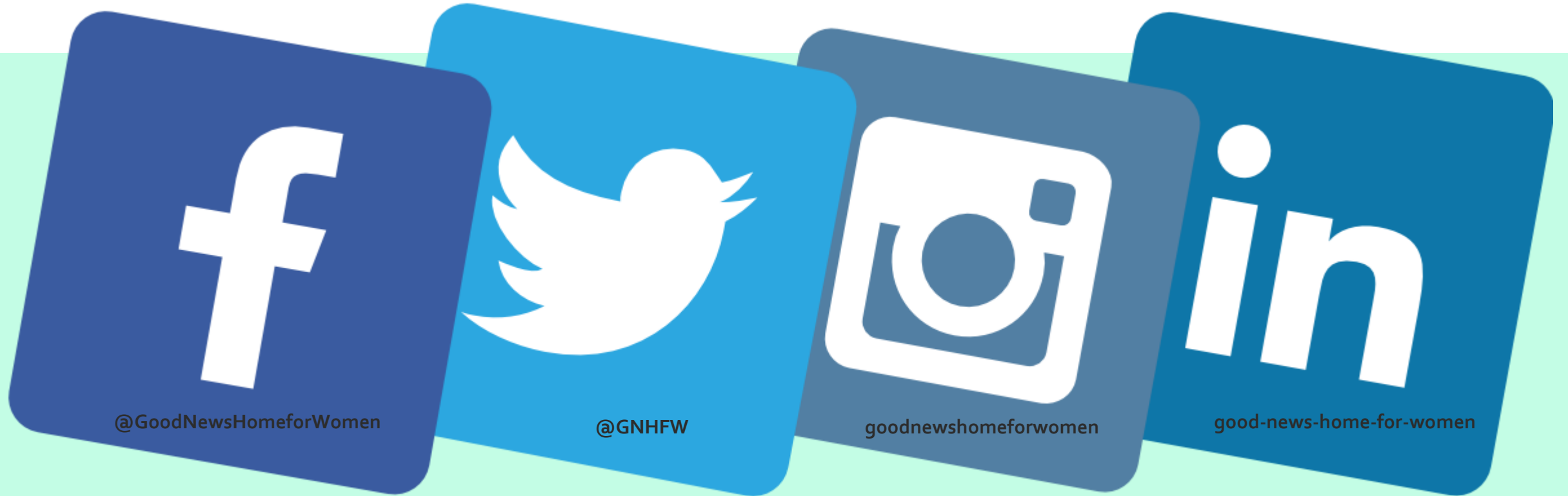
